
GEBRÜDER SIMON


- Ingo Simon and wife Kiki
- Middle Mosel, town Lösnich
- Founded 1724
- Translates to Winery Brothers Simon; in 1922 three brothers took over
- 17 acres; 4,200 cases
- Consulting oenologist in Georgia (Ukraine)
- Sustainable viticulture

GEBRÜDER SIMON

Sekt:

- Crafted from premium Riesling grapes that are hand picked and hand sorted
- From two of the Mosel's greatest vineyards:
 - Ürziger Würzgarten (Würzgarten = "Garden of Spices"); clay and sand stone soil; imparts complex exotic notes and the neighboring Erdener Treppchen (around the town of Erden, Treppchen = "small Steps"; clay slate and Devon slate soil; gives elegance
- Traditional Method; hand disgorged
- The dosage is derived from Riesling Auslese as opposed to base sugar extract. Crazy!
- Production: 600 cases






Geography & Climate


Climate

- Northern Continental
 - Mild summers, cold winters & mod precipitation year-round
- Long ripening season/long daylight
- Best sites = south/south-west facing hills
- Slopes and Rivers Increase Sunlight/Ripening
- Slate stores and radiates heat












Riesling is one of the so-called "Noble Grapes"


- First mentioned 1435 in the Rheingau
- Frost-resistant, late-ripening
- High natural acidity and fruit aromas
- Wines low to medium in alcohol
- Slowly builds sugar, keeps acidity
- Versatile: dry, medium dry, or sweet still wines; sparkling wine; dessert wines
- Aromatic with pronounced fruity, floral character



RIESLING

Appearance: Bright, low intensity lemon-green sometimes with visible effervescence Nose and Palate: peach, green apple, pear, orange, nectarine, green papaya, quince, lime, lemon, smoke. jasmine, chamomile, wet stones, chalk, white pepper, Thai basil, rosemary, honeysuckle, saffron, ginger Apricot and pineapple in riper styles High level of tartaric acid With bottle age: petrol, honey, marzipan, shortbread With botrytis: dried apricot/apricot nectar, honey, almond, raisin, beeswax Eiswein: Fresh snow, passionfruit, pineapple, baked apples






WEIDGUT Wwe. Dr.H. THANISCH













WEIDGUT Wwe. Dr.H. THANISCH

- Sofia Thanisch
- Founded in 1636; 11 generations
- Run by women for the last 5 generations
- Named after the widow of Sofia's great grandfather
 Dr. Huga Thanisch since 1895 (Wwe. = Widow)
- Thanisch Erben (=Heirs) since the division of the estate in 1980
- Only this family has direct lineage to the founders
- Only this estate is a VDP member
- VDP founding member in 1910

WEIDGUT Wwe. Dr.H. THANISCH

- South / South-west facing
- All vineyards in Bernkastel, 17 acres
- Devon grey slate
- 100% Riesling; all estate fruit
- Only steep slope cultivation; all hand harvested
- Grosse Lage: Bernkasteler Doctor
- Old vines, low yields; sustainable agriculture
- Stainless Steel and oak foudres
- Production: 4,000 cases




- Friedrich (Fritz) and his wife Manuela
- Founded 1763; Fritz 8th generation
- Rheinhessen region, town Westhofen
- 500 year old barrel cellar below historic market square
- Organic farming practices (not certified); 22 acres
- Two Grosse Lage (Grand Cru) Vineyards:
 - Aulerde: Loess with clayey, gravelly sands in the subsoil
 - Kirchspiel: limestone & clay marl
- Old oak barrels (1200 to 2600L), some stainless steel
- Annual production: 4,000 cases
- VDP member since 2000








The new pyramid of origin for Qualität and Prädikat wines



- Leiwen Klostergarten
- Leiwen Laurentiuslay
- Piesport Goldtröpfchen
- Trittenheim Apotheke




















- Werner Rosch and son Nico
- Middle Mosel, town Leiwen
- Werner Rosch, pro soccer player in his twenties
- Production: 100% Riesling
- Took over 3.7 acres early 1980s
- 21 acres; 6,300 cases
- Grosse Lagen: Trittenheimer Apotheke, Piesporter Goldtröpfchen (first Rosch vintage was 2013)



Leiwener Klostergarten (monastery garden of Leiwen)

- Vineyard faces east which protects from spring frost
- Light, easily warm stony-gravel to medium-heavy clay soils
- All wines made with spontaneous fermentation
- Stainless steel tanks, large neutral oak casks
- High quality wines for the price
- Fruit-driven Riesling






Wine region: **Mosel** Subregion: Ruwer








Erben von Veulwitz

- Herbert (Herbie) and wife Mechthild
- Founded 1867; Herbie since 1982
- Ruwer is a tributary to the Mosel, tiny river
- 30 miles before joining Mosel at Trier
- Member Bernkasteler Ring (regional association)
- Sustainable: wild herbs, green manure, bark mulch, green harvest
- Cellar in caves next to hotel they own (Hotel Weis)
- 1000L foudres and stainless steel



Erben von Weulwitz

- Kasel Nies'chen (Nies'chen nickname for Agnes)
- Devonian gray and blue slate bedrock, stony
- Very steep slope—is 70%; south/south west
- 80% old, ungrafted vines, some of which are more than 100 years old, on single vine trellises
- GG "Auf den Mauern" means "on the walls" and is located above a large retaining wall in the steepest sections
- GG "Im Taubenberg" means "in the dove mountain", special parcel



Emrich-Schönleber

- Nahe region, town Monzingen (coldest of region)
- Werner, Hanne, Frank and Anja Schönleber
- Estate over 250 years old; excl. wine since 1960s
- Werner took over in 1970s, Frank in mid 2000s
- Frank studied in Geisenheim, father role model
- Refocusing on dry Riesling; styles are deeply corepowered, with waves of electrically charged mineral impressions
- Perfect craftsmanship in both the vineyards and the cellar, which yields terroir-driven wines of tremendous polish and intention

Emrich-Schönleber

- Two Grosse Lage (Grand Cru) Vineyards:
 - -Halenberg: Devonian blue slate and hard black quartzite
 - profoundly mineral and intensely focused
 - -Frühlingsplätzchen: red slate, white quartzite, softer soils
 - more fat and roundness
- Started with 2 acres, now 21; own 60% of Halenberg
- Sustainability: soil, vineyards, employees, customers
- Trocken/GG: spontaneous fermentation in large old foudres
- Others: Stainless steel with cultured yeasts
- Annual production: 11,000 cases
- VDP member since 1994
